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PUBLIC SAFETY AND HOMELAND SECURITY BUREAU ANNOUNCES THE AVAILABILITY OF REVISED CHANNELIZATION PLANS FOR THE CONSOLIDATED 700 MHZ PUBLIC SAFETY NARROWBAND SPECTRUM

On July 31, 2007, the Commission adopted a *Second Report and Order* revising the rules governing the upper 700 MHz band.¹ In the *Second Report and Order*, the Commission redesignated ten megahertz of public safety 700 MHz spectrum (763-768/793-798 MHz) for the purpose of establishing a nationwide, interoperable broadband public safety communications network.² In connection with the establishment of the new broadband segment of the public safety 700 MHz spectrum, the Commission also consolidated the public safety 700 MHz narrowband channels (769-775/799-805 MHz).³

The Bureau has recently made available a revised chart that illustrates the channelization for the consolidated 700 MHz public safety narrowband spectrum. The channelization plan is available at <http://www.fcc.gov/pshs/spectrum/700mhz/techsum.html>.
